Synecdoche

4c. Rhetorical Over Statement

Hyperbole

This is the gospel that you heard and that has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven, and of which I, Paul, have become a servant. Colossians 1:23

(aka Exaggeration)

4d. Rhetorical Opposite Statement

Irony

Go to Bethel and sin; go to Gilgal and sin yet more..."

declares the Sovereign LORD.

Amos 4:4

When David returned home to bless his household, Michal daughter of Saul came out to meet him and said, "How the king of Israel has distinguished himself today, disrobing in the sight of the slave girls of his servants as any vulgar fellow would!"

2 Samuel 6:20

(aka Sarcasm)

4e. Substitution

• Euphemism

And Adam **knew** his wife Eve; and she conceived... **Genesis 4:1** KJV

(mild/indirect/vague for offensive/harsh/blunt)



5. Look for the Time Clues

(Special Prophecy Tool)

Dear children, **this is** the last hour; and as **you** have heard that antichrist is coming, even **now** many antichrists **have** come. This is how **we** know it **is** the last hour [of what?].

Jesus' Greatest Prophecy: His own death & resurrection

[After cleansing the temple] Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."

The Jews replied, "It has taken 46 years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?" But the temple he had spoken of was his body. After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the Scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.

Another Temple Prophecy

• At the **beginning** of Jesus' ministry:

[In Nazareth in the synagogue on the Sabbath, Jesus was handed the scroll of the prophet Isaiah.] Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written: "The spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." ... and he said to them, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing." Luke 4:16-21

Isaiah 61:2a & b


• Now, at the **end** of Jesus' ministry:






What did Jesus prophesy only hours before?

Case Study continued:

As Jesus was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the Temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately, "Tell us, when will these things happen? And what will be the sign that they are about to be fulfilled?" Mark 13:3-4

• And so Jesus does. See Matthew 24, Mark 13, Luke 21
